# A Letter from Adam R. Bronfman



Thirty years ago, my father was troubled by the discord and fragmentation he witnessed within the Jewish community. He created The Bronfman Fellowship in the hopes of forming an interdenominational cadre of young Jewish leaders with the knowledge, training, and commitment to "contribute to the well-being and strength of our people." Three decades later, I am proud to say that the Fellowship has evolved into a global community that exceeds what my father and I could have imagined.

I wish that my father, who passed away in 2013, could be here to witness this remarkable gathering of three decades of Bronfmanim. During the Fellowship's twenty-fifth anniversary, he expressed amazement at what the Fellows had accomplished.

As he wrote in a letter for that milestone event:

It gives me great pride to celebrate and reflect on 25 years of the Bronfman Youth Fellowships. What began as a vision for the future of Jewish individuals has turned into a realized community of Jewish pioneers. Founding BYFI was an investment in long-term change for the Jewish community, the results of which I never could have predicted. I am proud to see the fruits of the investment I made 25 years ago, as alumni of BYFI have come to represent the ideal of what a thoughtful, informed Jewish community can look like....

As someone who cares deeply for the Jewish community, I know there is constantly a new stream of challenges we must rise to meet. I see alumni tackling these challenges as they reimagine text study, inclusion, prayer, and American-Israeli relations for the Jewish community. I am confident the BYFI alumni will meet the changing needs of our people....

As I have said several times before, no group gives me more hope for our people's future than the 'Bronfmanim.' Your accomplishments and erudition as Jews - whatever you do or do not believe - gives me great pride in founding BYFI. Thank you all for giving me such nachas.

I am sure that my father would be even more filled with *nachas* today. It is my honor to perpetuate his praiseworthy vision by supporting the Fellowship, which continues to be The Samuel Bronfman Foundation's most valued project. As I told the 2017 Fellows when I visited them during their orientation, the model for communication in the Fellowship is not necessarily to agree, but to have empathy. I am awed and humbled when I see how Bronfmanim have put into practice the values my father lived by, strengthening the Jewish community and making the world a better place.
